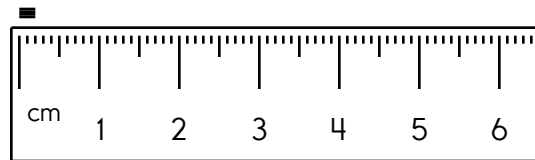
This is the look at one cube that is turned around a few times.
